Details regarding a number of events scheduled in the near future including the Fly-In on March 6th, the Harry Gould Pattern contest March 20-21, the Hemet IMAC competition April 9-11, a swap meet the 1st Saturday in May and a jet rally the 2nd week in June.

Carl Lindou announced a Field Cleanup Day for the main field on Saturday, April 3rd. The City of Hemet has agreed to start mowing the area (including tumbleweeds), sprayiing the weeds and picking up the trash cans. Stewart Robinson indicated that he had purchased the second Apprentice for the Introductiory Flight Training program from Dynamics Hobbies. Howard Hibbler and Don Radford donated money towards the purchase making the net cost to the club less than \$150. Thanks go to Howard and Don for their kindness and generosity.

The need to get going on the planning for the Jet Rally in June because we want to get a good turnout and advance marketing and planning will be critical.

12TH ANNUAL HARRY GOULD MEMORIAL PATTERN CONTEST

HOSTED BY HEMET MODEL MASTERS MARCH 20-21, 2021

Sportsman, Intermediate, Advanced, Masters, FAI (P-18, F-18), and FAI Silver if there is enough interest will be flown. Awards to 3rd place in each class. This is an AMA sanctioned event so proof of AMA membership must be provided when registering. Sportsman Class will be allowed to fly any AMA legal airplane. \$40 for all classes except Sportsman which is \$30. Lunch will be available at the field for a nominal fee. Water is complementary. Camping is allowed at the field – no hook-ups.

Field is open at 8:am, with pilots meeting at 8:45 – wheels up at 9:00. Sun is an issue here in the afternoon, so we must get things started early. 2 flight lines will be used with contestant judging. If we have 10 or more participants in Masters and/or Advanced, we may split the class for judging. For the last 2 rounds on Sunday, we will offer the F-18 schedule for FAI.

New rules in effect through the club that require a spotter to monitor full scale traffic through our airspace and if there is a conflict we will ask the pilots to reduce altitude to low level until full scale leaves our immediate area. If a new battery is needed, the pilot may land and replace. EDF's also can participate



Parking Plan For the Main Field

Parking by the shade structure is reserved for pilots. Non-flying individuals, spectators and guests are to park south of the shade structure. No RV's or trailers are allowed West of the Handicap parking area. If you are parking a trailer in front of the shade structure, the total length must not exceed 18 feet or you must unhook.

Safety At Club Flying Sites

Starting of any engines is north side of yellow line, aircraft facing runway. No taxing in the pits and staying within established perimeters , exceeding 400 ft ceiling. We have full scale aircraft overhead all the time and it only takes ONE incident to lose our field. No flying over the field workers on adjacent properties EVER!

All members are required to carry a first aid kit and fire extinguisher in their vehicles when flying. You never know when you or a fellow member will need some aid. Be prepared!! We strongly urge that no one fly alone.

TURBINE, IMAC and PATTERN MUST HAVE A SPOTTER WHEN FLYING!

Use of Club Facilities

You must be a member of our club or a guest to use our facilities. Members please have your membership cards with you when you fly. Guests (per the bylaws) are allowed to fly three times prior to joining but must have an active AMA membership. Guests and 72mhz flyers must have AMA on frequency board prior to flying!

The Hemet Model Masters will extend courtesy membership to any "Active Military" individual allowing them to fly at our club fields as long as they have a current AMA membership.

Retrieving Crashed Aircraft From the Aqueduct Near Our Main Field

Aqueduct Information for Retrieving crashed aircraft. Mike Thompson is the service representative that services the aqueduct near our main field. If your airplane is behind the second fence and not in the water runoff it is serviced by Mike Thompson. His direct line is 626 -844-5610. Note: Before calling be nice and explain that you are with the Hemet Model Masters and that you have crashed you're rc plane beyond the second fence and would like to retrieve it without breaking any laws. If your plane is between the first and second fence it is serviced by another agency (Securitas Security), Mike Thompson can not help you. Hopefully this will help our members to retrieve their aircraft.
