Hello fellow club members,

I hope everyone is doing well and you are enjoying our fine February weather. I would like to acknowledge some club members who have recently volunteered their time to improve the maintenance of our main field. Thanks go to Eddie Ayala and his daughter Isabella for bringing a 14' trailer and filling it with trash, broken tables, and tumble weeds and transporting it to the dump. The trailer was packed from top to bottom and front to the back. I would also like to thank Richard Lawrence for bringing a backhoe out and clearing some of the land around the field. We still have a lot of work to do to get our field in good shape and volunteers are always appreciated. We have a lot of tumbleweeds which are a fire hazard and detract from the look of the field.

We have several events scheduled over the next 4 months. Our first will be a fly-in on March 6th and all types of aircraft are eligible and welcome. The event will include food and a raffle. We hope all our members will attend so we can get to know one another better and develop a sense of club unity. There will be a nominal \$10 landing fee to help offset the cost of food and raffle prizes. Other events include the annual Harry Gould Pattern competition March 20th and 21st, the HMM IMAC competition April 9th, 10th, and 11th and a swap meet the first Saturday in May. We also hope to schedule a Jet Rally for June and are working on a date.

Speaking of the Pattern contest I hope you'll try to go out to either participate in the contest or spectate. The contestants at these events are very talented and extremely disciplined. For newer flyers, competing in Pattern is great way to build flying skill and learn how to improve your control of your airplane.

Please note, we will be moving our General Membership Meeting for March up one week to the second Saturday, March 13th so as not to conflict with the Harry Gould event so please mark that change on your calendars now.

On a safety note – PLEASE DO NOT TAXI IN THE PIT AREA. This applies to all aircraft whether propeller driven, EDF or turbine. Always remember to secure your aircraft while starting it or adjusting the radio while the engine is running or the engine is armed (battery is connected). ALWAYS. A runaway model is very dangerous and we've had some close calls recently. Remember, safety is everyone's responsibility.

Important Note From Howard Hibbler, Club Safety Officer



Minutes for February 2, 2021

Meeting called to order by President Carl Lindou at 7:04pm

Club Officers and Board Members Present—Carl Lindou, Mario Muniz, Stewart Robinson, Steve Staudenmeir, Richard Lawrence, Kevin McDonald, Don Radford, Dave Kennedy, and Lawrence Vazquez

No guests or other members attended the meeting.

Update regarding the lawsuit— The attorney representing the club had a conference call with the judge and the plaintiff's attorney to discuss the demurrer submitted by the club objecting to the plaintiff's claims. The judge directed the plaintiff's attorney to respond in writing to the objections stated in the demurrer. It is our understanding that nothing further will happen until the plaintiff submits their response to the court.

We discussed and formalized a parking plan for the main field to reduce misunderstanding and optimize parking. Refer to a the parking plan diagram in this newsletter.

Regarding safety, it has been noticed that people are again taxiing airplanes in the pits. We will reiterate to the membership that there is to be no taxiing in the pits behind the yellow line. This applies to all aircraft whether propeller, EDF or turbine. Also, members need to be reminded that all gas-powered airplanes with electronic ignition systems need to be equipped with an electronic kill switch. Electric planes must have a throttle cut active.

Field maintenance has been an ongoing discussion and there are a lot of tumbleweeds on the field right now. Mario offered to speak with the farmer to see if we could get help from them as we have in the past.

We discussed the schedule for a number of events including a Fly-In on March 6th, the Harry Gould Pattern contest March 20-21, the Hemet IMAC competition April 9-11, a swap meet the 1st Saturday in May and a jet rally the 2nd week in June.

Due to the scheduling of the Harry Gould event, the general membership meeting will be moved up one week to March 13th at 9:00AM.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:55 PM.

12TH ANNUAL HARRY GOULD MEMORIAL PATTERN CONTEST

HOSTED BY HEMET MODEL MASTERS MARCH 20-21, 2021

Sportsman, Intermediate, Advanced, Masters, FAI (P-18, F-18), and FAI Silver if there is enough interest will be flown. Awards to 3rd place in each class. This is an AMA sanctioned event so proof of AMA membership must be provided when registering. Sportsman Class will be allowed to fly any AMA legal airplane. \$40 for all classes except Sportsman which is \$30. Lunch will be available at the field for a nominal fee. Water is complementary. Camping is allowed at the field – no hook-ups.

Field is open at 8:am, with pilots meeting at 8:45 – wheels up at 9:00. Sun is an issue here in the afternoon, so we must get things started early. 2 flight lines will be used with contestant judging. 

Safety At Club Flying Sites

Starting of any engines is north side of yellow line, aircraft facing runway. No taxing in the pits and staying within established perimeters, exceeding 400 ft ceiling. We have full scale aircraft overhead all the time and it only takes ONE incident to lose our field. No flying over the field workers on adjacent properties EVER!

All members are required to carry a first aid kit and fire extinguisher in their vehicles when flying. You never know when you or a fellow member will need some aid. Be prepared!! We strongly urge that no one fly alone.

TURBINE, IMAC and PATTERN MUST HAVE A SPOTTER WHEN FLYING!

Use of Club Facilities

You must be a member of our club or a guest to use our facilities. Members please have your membership cards with you when you fly. Guests (per the bylaws) are allowed to fly three times prior to joining but must have an active AMA membership. Guests and 72mhz flyers must have AMA on frequency board prior to flying!

The Hemet Model Masters will extend courtesy membership to any "Active Military" individual allowing them to fly at our club fields as long as they have a current AMA membership.

Retrieving Crashed Aircraft From the Aqueduct Near Our Main Field

Aqueduct Information for Retrieving crashed aircraft. Mike Thompson is the service representative that services the aqueduct near our main field. If your airplane is behind the second fence and not in the water runoff it is serviced by Mike Thompson. His direct line is 626 -844-5610. Note: Before calling be nice and explain that you are with the Hemet Model Masters and that you have crashed you're rc plane beyond the second fence and would like to retrieve it without breaking any laws. If your plane is between the first and second fence it is serviced by another agency (Securitas Security), Mike Thompson can not help you. Hopefully this will help our members to retrieve their aircraft.
