Also, just to let you know, since we did not have a general meeting in May, the May and June newsletters have been combined into one this month.


Stay hydrated, keep flying, and keep an eye out for snakes.

#### Volunteers Are Always Wanted And Needed!!

As you know, last year the club membership voted to increase annual dues to \$100 but also adopted a volunteer credit of up to \$40 so that volunteers would pay the same amount as they had before. The good news is that there are many ways to earn volunteer credits. If you have physical or other limitations we can still use you. Volunteer activities include cleaning up at the field, field maintenance (spraying, etc.), helping out at club events, assisting with the flight training program, food preparation, etc. If you would like to serve as a volunteer please let Carl Lindou, Steve Staudenmeir or Rodney Luker know which types of tasks you would be willing to help out with and we will help find the right opportunities for you. #### The May Fun Fly Was Fun!

Instead of our regular General Membership Meeting, on May 21st we held a Fun Fly. A great time was had by all. We had three fun competitive events. In Spot Landing, concentric circles are laid out in chalk on the runway like a bullseye. The highest score is awarded for touching wheels down in the inside circle, a lower score for the circle outside of that and so on. Each flyer gets three attempts to get the highest combined score which determines the winner. The next event was the Roll, Roll, Roll. In this event, the competing pilot rolls two dice to get a number between 2 and 12. Then they takeoff their plane, do three maneuvers of any type, e.g. three rolls, three loops, etc. and lands their plane. Then it's back to the dice and they have to roll until they get the number they rolled prior to starting the maneuver. The pilot with the shortest elapsed time wins. It's fun because the dice rolls even things out between the beginning and more experienced flyers. The third event was the Timed Flight Challenge. The timer starts when you take your plane off. Whoever can land closest to exactly one minute (without help from your radio timer) wins. It turns out to be hard to count one-one-thousand, two-one -thousand, while flying an airplane. We also held a raffle and had lunch. We are planning to have Fun Fly's like this one about once every three month and we look forward to increasing participation in the future. RC clubs are a lot about the friendships developed and Fun Fly's are a great opportunity to find new ones and get to know others.



Minutes for May 2nd, 2022

Meeting called to order by President Carl Lindou at 7:04PM. The meeting was held on-line.

Club Officers and Board Members Present — Carl Lindou, Rodney Luker, Steve Staudenmeir, Garrison Rios, Kevin McDonald, Larry Mason, Tom Mulder, Lou Renteria, Dave Kennedy and Howard Hibbler.

Former Treasurer Stewart Robinson attended the meeting as a guest.

Stewart Robinson and Carl Lindou discussed the status of the lawsuit based upon the most recent meeting with the plaintiff, the attorneys and the appointed judge. A tentative settlement has been reached. Part of the terms of the settlement are that we don't discuss it outside the Board of Directors. (See note below)

The club Fun Fly is on for May 21st starting at 9:00am. As a result, there will be no General Membership Meeting for the month of May. Steve Staudenmeir will send out an email announcement regarding the Fun Fly. A raffle will be held.

The June Jet Rally is on for June 9th to the 12th. Tom Mulder will speak with Mario about the event planning to see what if any assistance might be required. We had a brief phone conversation with Mario and he indicated that letters have gone out to potential sponsors.

The Board briefly discussed the need to update the club bylaws once the lawsuit is resolved.

There was some push back because until recently many members have not received their cards or renewal stickers. This is a topic to be discussed at the next General Membership Meeting.

Steve also agreed to speak with Ken Young to see if he could take pictures at the event.

There was a lengthy discussion regarding the status of the lawsuit and our efforts to settle it. As in the past, the judge has informed us not to discuss the details of any such efforts or related discussions.

Greg Stone, our club's local AMA representative, and his home club (Orange County Modelers Association) has worked with attorneys and the AMA to develop an updated bylaws and code of conduct. We are reviewing to see if we could use it as a model to prevent events and conduct that might lead to a lawsuit in the future.



No RV's or trailers are allowed West of the Handicap parking area. If you are parking a trailer in front of the shade structure, the total length must not exceed 18 feet or you must unhook.

## Safety At Club Flying Sites

Starting of any engines is north side of yellow line, aircraft facing runway. No taxing in the pits and staying within established perimeters , exceeding 400 ft ceiling. We have full scale aircraft overhead all the time and it only takes ONE incident to lose our field. No flying over the field workers on adjacent properties EVER!

All members are required to carry a first aid kit and fire extinguisher in their vehicles when flying. You never know when you or a fellow member will need some aid. Be prepared!! We strongly urge that no one fly alone.

TURBINE, IMAC and PATTERN MUST HAVE A SPOTTER WHEN FLYING!

#### **Use of Club Facilities**

You must be a member of our club or a guest to use our facilities. Members please have your membership cards with you when you fly. Guests (per the bylaws) are allowed to fly three times prior to joining but must have an active AMA membership. Guests and 72mhz flyers must have AMA on frequency board prior to flying!

The Hemet Model Masters will extend courtesy membership to any "Active Military" individual allowing them to fly at our club fields as long as they have a current AMA membership.

#### Retrieving Crashed Aircraft From the Aqueduct Near Our Main Field

Aqueduct Information for Retrieving crashed aircraft. Mike Thompson is the service representative that services the aqueduct near our main field. If your airplane is behind the second fence and not in the water runoff it is serviced by Mike Thompson. His direct line is 626 -844-5610. Note: Before calling be nice and explain that you are with the Hemet Model Masters and that you have crashed you're rc plane beyond the second fence and would like to retrieve it without breaking any laws. If your plane is between the first and second fence it is serviced by another agency (Securitas Security), Mike Thompson can not help you. Hopefully this will help our members to retrieve their aircraft.
