Discussion opened up about approximate costs for the new runway project. It was decided to put the ideas and costs of the runway project to the members and have a final decision by the August General Meeting. Emails will be sent out to all members for their input prior to the meeting so that the majority of the members can choose how to proceed.

Steve Staudenmeir brought up the issue about spotters and what their function is suppose to be. The spotters must be more diligent with why they are out there.

Scott Boersma had a suggestion. When numerous turbines are at the flying field, perhaps amongst themselves choose a designated pilot to unhook his truck from his trailer with an extinguisher to be a rescue vehicle for downed aircraft. This would help to get to the plane faster in case of a fire.

The idea will be presented to the members at the next general meeting for discussion.

Stewart Robinson asked about the quad and if the club was prepared to purchase it. The membership voted overwhelmingly to go ahead with the purchase. A spray unit will be purchased in the future so that we can maintain and minimize the weed growth.

Secretary Mario Muniz has contacted the City of Hemet and asked f we could get someone from the city to mow the property, they stated that they could come out in July to take care of the over growth.

Aqueduct Information for Retrieving crashed aircraft. Mike Thompson is the service representative that services the aqueduct near our main field. If your airplane is behind the second fence and not in the water runoff it is serviced by Mike Thompson. His direct line is 626-844-5610. Note: Before calling be nice and explain that you are with the Hemet Model Masters and that you have crashed you're rc plane beyond the second fence and would like to retrieve it without breaking any laws. If your plane is between the first and second fence it is serviced by another agency (Securitas Security), Mike Thompson can not help you. Hopefully this will help our members to retrieve their aircraft.


Permanent TFRs issued for major sporting events and Disney properties

On October 27, the FAA issued three Permanent Temporary Flight Restrictions (TFRs) creating restrictions for the airspace surrounding major sporting events and the Disney properties in Anaheim CA and Orlando FL. The new flight restrictions permanently prohibit the operation of unmanned and radio-controlled model aircraft within roughly 3.5 miles of both the Disneyland and Walt Disney World theme parks. The restrictions are also in place for a period of one hour before and one hour after major sporting events.



RULES AND SAFETY AT THE FIELD

SPOTTERS, SMOKING

The purpose for having spotters as mentioned many, many times over the years is to look out for FULL SCALE AIRCRAFT entering our air space. Some pilots have spotters but the spotter is not doing the job they are suppose to do. They are focused on the airplane and what the pilot is doing, that is not why you are out there with a pilot. Focus on why you are out there, scan and listen for full scale aircraft and notify your pilot of their location and if need be tell the pilot to drop altitude immediately. Pilots when flying, if you hear full scale shouted out, drop your altitude immediately. Do not continue any maneuvers or sequence.

When more than one rc plane is in the air, maintain the flight pattern. At Simpson field it is clockwise. Take offs are normally right to left unless the winds are reversed but the pattern is still clockwise when multiple aircraft are in the air.

Safety is everyone's responsibility be more diligent about your surroundings.

SMOKING

A huge battle was fought a few years ago about smoking at the field and some compromises were made. New members are not aware of some of the club rules and some just don't care and continue to ignore posted signs. There is no smoking north of the yellow pit line. Not in the pits not on the flight line.

There are FIVE 5 flight stations and they are numbered. This is where you fly from.

SAFETY AT THE FLYING SITES

PLEASE ADHERE TO CLUB SAFETY POLICIES, THESE WERE PUT IN PLACE BY YOU THE MEMBERS AND A FEW OF YOU CONTINUE TO IGNORE THEM.

Starting of any engines is north side of yellow line, aircraft facing runway exception Turbines. No taxing in the pits and stay within established perimeters, exceeding 400 ft ceiling. We have full scale aircraft overhead all the time and it only takes ONE incident to lose our field. No flying over the field workers on adjacent properties EVER!
