Hello fellow club members,

While at Top Gun I ran into Rich and Tyler, a father and son who were competing in the Pro-Am Jet class. I knew that they had flown at our field and I thought they had joined the club. I hadn't seen them in quite a while however. I also knew they had been practicing for Top-Gun and driving quite far compared to coming out to the club field. So, I asked why aren't you coming to the club field to fly. The Father, who's no light weight, said very reluctantly that some of the members were quite unfriendly. And the son who was 17 at the time said and I quote: There's too many "GRUMPTOADS" at that field. I thought what a shame, they are driving so far out of there way to go fly when we have the perfect flying field all because peoples attitude left a negative impression, and they had the perception that wasn't favorable to the club. I reached out recently looking for volunteers for help at the field. I got a call from Mr. Mathews, a club member, who said he wanted to help. He said he loves the field but doesn't fly here. I asked why, "People are negative and so competitive out there". People left him with a very bad impression and now his perception is we are all that way. And I know that's not the actual reality, however his perception is based on the impression he got from some club members and that is reality to him. And the most recent problem happened a couple of weeks ago where a mom brought her son out to get help learning to fly his electric airplane. The boy and one of our club members who was instructing him were flying. Another club member came up to the boy and told the boy he was going to take off. The boy didn't respond most likely because he didn't know what to say. And several people witnessed the person who wanted to take off raise their voice at the boy and repeatedly bark out I'm taking off. Now we do have to be able to communicate with one another. But several club members were left feeling upset and disheartened by the whole encounter. If there is a trainee up. Why not just give them the sky. The boy's airplane flew for about 6 minutes. We should be able to wait six minutes to ensure the person whose training and in this case the mom is left with a positive impression. But if you cannot wait, announce your intention to take the runway or to land to the instructor or the instructor's spotter. Not the Student. Remember the old saying. You only get one shot to make a first good impression. Please do not be a GRUMPTOAD! Social media is far too powerful. And when people have bad experiences, they will go on Facebook or the internet and leave negative posts. of us.

And the people that read those posts either won't come to the club field or already have a jaded perception of us as a club.

I start my articles with "Hello friends" because I have a lot of great friends that I met in this club. I hope we all share that same experience. The club is more than a field. It's a place where we share a common interest. We learn from each other, and we build something together. And we create friendships. It's a place where we share our passion for flight. That passion for flight may take the form of a pattern plane or a big IMAC aircraft or a trainer or a warbird or a turbine. Me, I just enjoy it all. I like flying my Jet and flying my WWI Triplane. And I really enjoy watching people enjoy their passion for flight. Let's give people that visit our field a good first impression let people perceive who we are—an open friendly welcoming group who share a passion for model aviation.

Now sometimes people want to talk to us while were putting our plane together. And some of our planes are complicated to put together. They can have multiple electrical hook ups. Air lines connections. Multiple bolts. Multiple batteries with differing voltages to connect and check. It is very easy to forget or miss a step. When I flew my 40% Extra 300. I was putting it together when a young man started to talk to me about my plane. I had connected the aileron servos and put the two 1/4x20 bolts in the right wing. I then connected the ailerons for the left wing and put the rear anti rotation bolt in the wing I had the bolt about halfway screwed in When young man asked me about the modification I made to the horizontal stab and vertical fin and rudder. I stopped what I was doing and turned to the rear of the plane and went over all the modifications with him. I then went back to putting the Extra together, I fueled and started the DA-150. After take off I immediately something was wrong. My plane flew on rails normally. But it was all over the sky. I got around and landed and it hit me. I didn't put the front anti rotation bolt in the front of the left wing, and I hadn't even tightened the rear bolt. On the taxi back the rear bolt fell out and the wing rotated. That taught me a huge lesson. From then on when I put my aircraft together and someone asked me questions about my plane I tell them: I will answer any question you have. But right now, I must focus on putting my aircraft together. Please give me 10 minutes and I will be right with you. I'm not rude but I get my message across that I must stay focused on the task at hand.

Okay I have gone on long enough.

Take care my friends, And Happy landings.

Nominations Are Due For Officers and Board Members for 2025



Please Pay Your Dues

We have noted that sometimes members are unaware that their AMA membership has lapsed during the year. Please take the time to verify that your AMA membership is current throughout the year to prevent loss of flying privileges. If your AMA membership has expired please renew it prior to coming out to fly. Thank you for your compliance with this requirement.

As you know, last year the club membership voted to increase annual dues to \$125 but also adopted a volunteer credit of up to \$40 so that volunteers would pay the same amount as they had before. 

Parking Plan For the Main Field

Parking by the shade structure is reserved for pilots. Non-flying individuals, spectators and guests are to park south of the shade structure. No RV's or trailers are allowed West of the Handicap parking area. If you are parking a trailer in front of the shade structure, the total length must not exceed 18 feet or you must unhook.

Safety At Club Flying Sites

Starting of any engines is north side of yellow line, aircraft facing runway. No taxing in the pits and staying within established perimeters , exceeding 400 ft ceiling. We have full scale aircraft overhead all the time and it only takes ONE incident to lose our field. No flying over the field workers on adjacent properties EVER!

All members are required to carry a first aid kit and fire extinguisher in their vehicles when flying. You never know when you or a fellow member will need some aid. Be prepared!! We strongly urge that no one fly alone.

TURBINE, IMAC and PATTERN MUST HAVE A SPOTTER WHEN FLYING!

Use of Club Facilities

You must be a member of our club or a guest to use our facilities. Members please have your membership cards with you when you fly. Guests (per the bylaws) are allowed to fly three times prior to joining but must have an active AMA membership and comply with all AMA and FAA requirements regarding registration, TRUST, etc. . Guests and 72mhz flyers must have AMA on frequency board prior to flying!

The Hemet Model Masters will extend courtesy membership to any "Active Military" or "First Responders" allowing them to fly at our club fields as long as they have a current AMA mem-
